# ABOUT TN SHAKESPEARE COMPANY

Tennessee Shakespeare Company is the first and still only professional, not-for-profit theatre and education organization in Memphis dedicated to producing live, diverse performances of William Shakespeare's plays, as well as works of social significance by classical, Southern, and modern playwrights/composers; and to providing innovative education, training, and outreach programming.

In 2017, we purchased our first performing arts facility, which is being renovated into the state's only permanent home for professional, year-round Shakespeare performance, education, and training.

Across 17 seasons, we have achieved over 735,000 points of contact through 75 productions in 45 community venues; have educated over 300,000 students in 130 area schools; have served the health needs of 1,100 veterans at the Memphis V.A. Medical Center; and have brought Shakespeare and creative writing to nearly 700 youths in three county detention centers. The most recent Arts & Economic Prosperity Study, facilitated by ARTSmemphis, revealed that TSC had an economic impact on our surrounding area of approximately \$2.8 million in the last year. Our Education and Outreach Program has achieved a high regional and national profile, and partners annually with most local school systems.

TSC's vision is to sustain a classical, professional theatre in Memphis that nurtures artists creatively and financially; and encourages audiences to exaltation, curiosity, and wonderment; a center for the community dedicated to re-discovering our faith in life by increasing our awareness of reality and expanding our imagination through an emphasis on the performance, education, and training of William Shakespeare's works.

We believe William Shakespeare and his stories are for everyone – as diverse as the characters with whom he populates his plays. We believe the plays of Shakespeare should be central to every child's formal education. We believe Memphis and Tennessee deserve a sustainable world-class, professional Shakespeare company.

Welcome to Tennessee Shakespeare Company and our 18<sup>th</sup> performance season! We are honored that you are joining us.

This season, we are making you a promise on stage. It's a good-news story for Memphis, and it's unique in the United States.

Tennessee Shakespeare Company will produce for you and your family more classical and Shakespeare titles in 2025-26 than any other regional, professional theatre company in the country.

If that sounds like a big statement, it is. And it's true. Even during a time when all of TSC's historically-earned federal grants have been either cancelled or eliminated, we will not reduce our classical offerings for you or our schoolchildren, our military veterans, our detained teens, or our underserved communities.

Instead, we are doubling our Free Shout-Out Shakespeare Series productions with *Much Ado About Nothing* and *Romeo and Juliet*. We will still tour *Macbeth* to our schools. We are launching a new Classical Comedies reading series featuring *Tartuffe*, *Three Sisters*, and *Blithe Spirit*. We will give you a new double-bill of holiday one-acts from Dylan Thomas and Sir Arthur Conan Doyle (Sherlock!), as well as the literary genius that launched a country's independence with our St. Patrick's Day Salon. And we will give you a fun, songful experience of *The Taming of the Shrew*.

Plays and stories are called "classical" because each of us can see ourselves in them; and they are stories for all time, they are entertaining, and they have healing power. When you choose to come to the theatre, you aren't coming to see us on stage. You're coming to see yourself, to widen your possibilities, to think differently, to seek inspiration, to question, to enjoy yourself in your community. Even in a season filled with comedy, these are serious endeavors for us here.

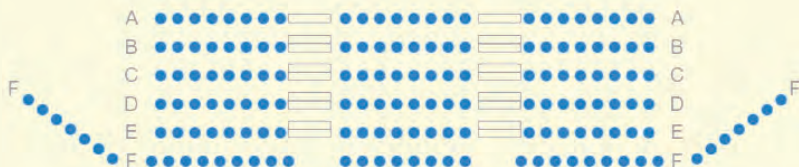

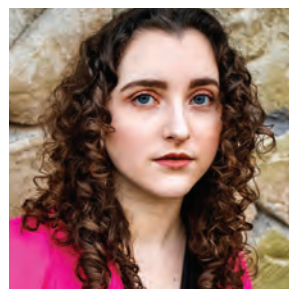

Mr. Bluestein is a past winner of the American Theatre Association's John C. Barner Award, and has served as an arts advisory panelist for numerous organizations, including the National Endowment for the Arts. In addition to acting as a senior advisor for TSC, he currently serves as executive director of the Tennessee Arts Academy, a leading state-wide professional development institute for arts teachers located in Nashville. Mr. Bluestein spent several years as director of shows at Opryland, USA, and he most recently wrote and directed the national touring production of *Beale Street Saturday Night* starring blues legend Joyce Cobb. In 2013, he was inducted into the Educational Theatre Association's Hall of Fame in Minneapolis and in 2021 he was named by Tennessee Governor Bill Lee as a recipient of the Tennessee Governor's Arts Award, Tennessee's highest honor in the arts.

**ANTON CHEKHOV (PLAYWRIGHT OF *THREE SISTERS*)** was born in 1860 in Taganrog, Russia, the grandson of a serf, the son of a struggling merchant, and became both a successful physician with a wide-ranging practice and a prolific writer. By the time he created *Three Sisters* in 1900, he had already transformed the short story and was remaking theatre with a quiet revolution aided by the renowned Moscow Art Theatre. Chekhov gave modern drama a new framework: subtext, ensemble, and truth in the everyday. Scholars often referred to Chekhov as one of the seminal figures in the birth of early modernism in the theatre. His other plays that are produced annually include *Uncle Vanya*, *The Cherry Orchard*, and *The Seagull*.

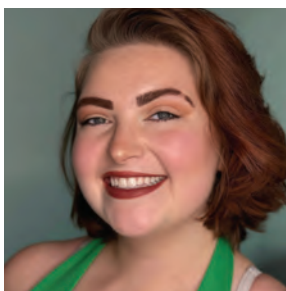

**NOËL COWARD (PLAYWRIGHT OF *BLITHE SPIRIT*)** was born in 1899 in Teddington, England, and began performing as a child before turning to writing plays in his early twenties. Over the next five decades, he became one of Britain's most prolific and recognizable theatre figures, known for sharp dialogue, unforced humor, and an instinct for timing both on stage and off. He wrote more than 65 plays and musicals, and he acted in nearly 90 stage productions and films. In 1941, during the height of WWII, he wrote *Blithe Spirit*, a comedy about death and marriage that ran for nearly 2,000 performances in London and gave audiences relief through laughter. His other popular plays include *Hay Fever*, *Private Lives*, and *Present Laughter*.

**SIR ARTHUR CONAN DOYLE (AUTHOR OF *THE ADVENTURE OF THE BLUE CARBUNCLE*)** was born in Edinburgh, Scotland, in 1859 and became a physician and prolific writer. In 1887, with *A Study in Scarlet*, he introduced Sherlock Holmes and Dr. Watson, characters who would come to define detective fiction and inspire readers to look for reason

and evidence across 56 short stories. Beyond Holmes, Doyle wrote historical novels, science fiction, and essays, and late in life became a public advocate for spiritualism.

Synge, Robert Browning, Lord Tennyson, and Henry James, Lady Gregory was an inspired dramatist, poet, and correspondent.

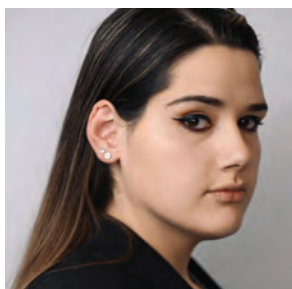

**MOLIÈRE (PLAYWRIGHT OF TARTUFFE)** was born Jean-Baptiste Poquelin in Paris in 1622. He walked away from a secure future with his prosperous family in order to form a theatre company at age 21 and soon became known by his stage name

of “Molière.” After years touring the provinces, he returned to Paris and became the leading comic playwright of 17<sup>th</sup> century France. His plays combined sharp social observation with physical comedy, and they exposed hypocrisy and vanity, while entertaining both court and public -- although with controversy. *Tartuffe* was suppressed and censored due to opposition from the archbishop of Paris, and other members of the church and upper-class society, over its portrayal of someone who is outwardly pious but is truly deceitful and greedy (the *Imposter* of the play’s sub-title). Among his plays that continue their popularity are *The Imaginary Invalid*, *The Learned Ladies*, *The Miser*, *The Misanthrope*, and *The School for Wives*.



**MYRA PLATT (ADAPTER OF A CHILD’S CHRISTMAS IN WALES)**

is a part-time lecturer of Topics in Youth and Theatre. She was the founding Co-Artistic Director (with Jane Jones) of Book-It Repertory Theatre. Book-It was the recipient of Seattle’s 2010 Mayor’s Arts Award and Washington State’s 2012 Governor’s Arts Award. In 2010, she and Jane received a

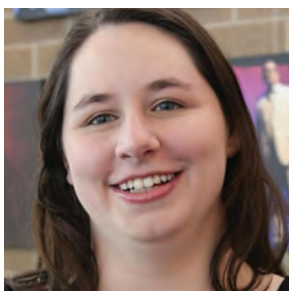
Paul G. Allen Family Foundation Anniversary grant, as well as the 2010 Women of Influence recognition from *Puget Sound Business Journal*. **WILLIAM SHAKESPEARE (1564-1616) (PLAYWRIGHT OF MUCH ADO ABOUT NOTHING, MACBETH, ROMEO AND JULIET, THE TAMING OF THE SHREW)** served, posthumously, as the meeting ground around which many of the creators of the U.S. Constitution gathered for intellectual, compassionate debate. While Locke and Bacon and recent revolutions provided partial blueprints for an experimental democratic Republic here, it was Shakespeare’s *Henry V*, *Henry VIII*, *Othello*, *Hamlet*, and *King Lear*, and even his comedies, that offered common language, a multiplicity of perspectives, a

poetic inclination that projected to a life beyond today, and a reasoned hope if only by a stark omission of narrative. That omission in the plays, other than in the cosmic *Lear*, was a healthy national government. It was perhaps this omission that John Jay, Thomas Jefferson, George Washington, Benjamin Franklin, James Madison, and John Adams et. al. grasped as a requirement of our country's governing framework -- one of transparency, accountability, and checks and balances so that no one person or group could wield power alone. When Alexis de Tocqueville toured the U.S. in the early 19<sup>th</sup> Century, he observed that nearly every pilgrim's hut sheltered a bound copy of William Shakespeare's plays. Indeed, President Lincoln, whose adoration for *Macbeth* is well-publicized, paraphrased Portia from *The Merchant of Venice* in his written summation of his public 1862 proclamation that anticipated a national abolition of slavery: "The change it contemplates would come gently as the dews of heaven, not rending or wrecking anything. Will you not embrace it?" The plays of William Shakespeare are our country's gathering place. Lest we forget.

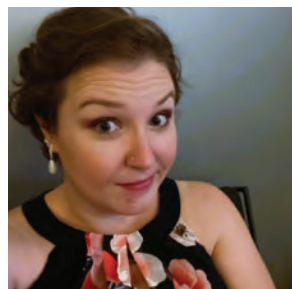

## TSC'S 2025-26 CLASSICAL THEATRE APPRENTICE PROGRAM

Our third class of TSC's seven-month Classical Theatre Apprentice Program began on Labor Day 2025, welcoming five deserving actors/stage managers from around the country to perform, train, and teach with us through March 2026. They were selected through a rigorous audition and interview process from a field of more than 100 applicants.

The CTA Program is focused on experiential, classical stage performance/production training and work designed to help emerging theatre artists launch and sustain their early professional careers. The Program focuses on immersive career development opportunities. Apprentices are guaranteed to act and teach or stage manage in multiple areas in a variety of productions.

Program training is supervised by Producing Artistic Director Dan McCleary and focuses on developing the classical actor in areas of voice, movement, actor-audience relationship, structure of Shakespeare's verse, clowning, dance, fight, auditioning, and the business of marketing oneself as an actor. Training includes master classes, mock auditions, and ongoing specialty training classes with TSC staff.

The Program is managed by Stephanie Shine, and its teachers include Sarah Hankins, Lauren Gunn, Stephanie, and Dan. As of this writing, all of our CTA alumni are either working in theatre or have been accepted into prestigious MFA programs around the country.

Apprentices work and train as TSC employees and receive a monthly salary while in Memphis. They provide their own accommodations and travel. ### THE JACK JONES CHILDREN'S LITERACY FUND

Launched in 2021 by Jack's loving wife Sandra and the entire Jones family, this Fund supports our efforts to teach underserved children in the Memphis area how to read by offering our time, compassion, and books (donated by our partners, The Friends of the Hooks Public Library). TSC's teachers already help students raise their Language Arts grades by an average of one letter in a matter of weeks. Imagine what we can do with more books, more time, and more teachers who care.

## THE MACBETH INITIATIVE

Now in its fifth season, *The Macbeth Initiative* brings in-classroom experiences, teacher-training opportunities, and a 90-minute production of *Macbeth* with a talkback to schools throughout Shelby County and the Mid-South. *The Initiative* provides students with an opportunity to connect with Shakespeare's characters and the play through an interactive class, taught by TSC's Teaching-Artist team, which is comprised largely by the cast. Students are posed questions about the characters' choices and decisions, which prompt conversations about the needs of the individual versus the needs of a community—a discussion that informs their connection to the performance. Our *Macbeth Initiative* tour is performed by professional actors and is often students' first experience with live performance or Shakespeare. Thanks to our generous donors, we are able to provide this vital resource at the lowest possible cost to Title I schools and schools in need.

## THE ROMEO AND JULIET PROJECT

Launched over a decade ago in response to the Memphis Mayor Wharton's request for creative solutions to teenagers' armed violence, our celebrated *Romeo and Juliet Project* inspires students to get on their feet and perform Shakespeare's text. The play becomes a performance experience rather than simply another book to read in class. By understanding the characters' real-time decisions in times of crisis, students have the opportunity to rehearse alternate responses to the characters' decisions, confronting youth-on-youth violence, suicidal ideation, and grief. *The Project* consists of a series of in-class experiences called playshops and a 90-minute production of *Romeo and Juliet* that tours to their school. By being on-site with students, we meet them in their environment and transform their school into a welcoming place for Shakespeare and performance. Participating students' ELA grades rise by at least a half-letter, and 90% of them report they now see Shakespeare as more relevant than before. *The Project* is made possible, in part, by the Tennessee Arts Commission.



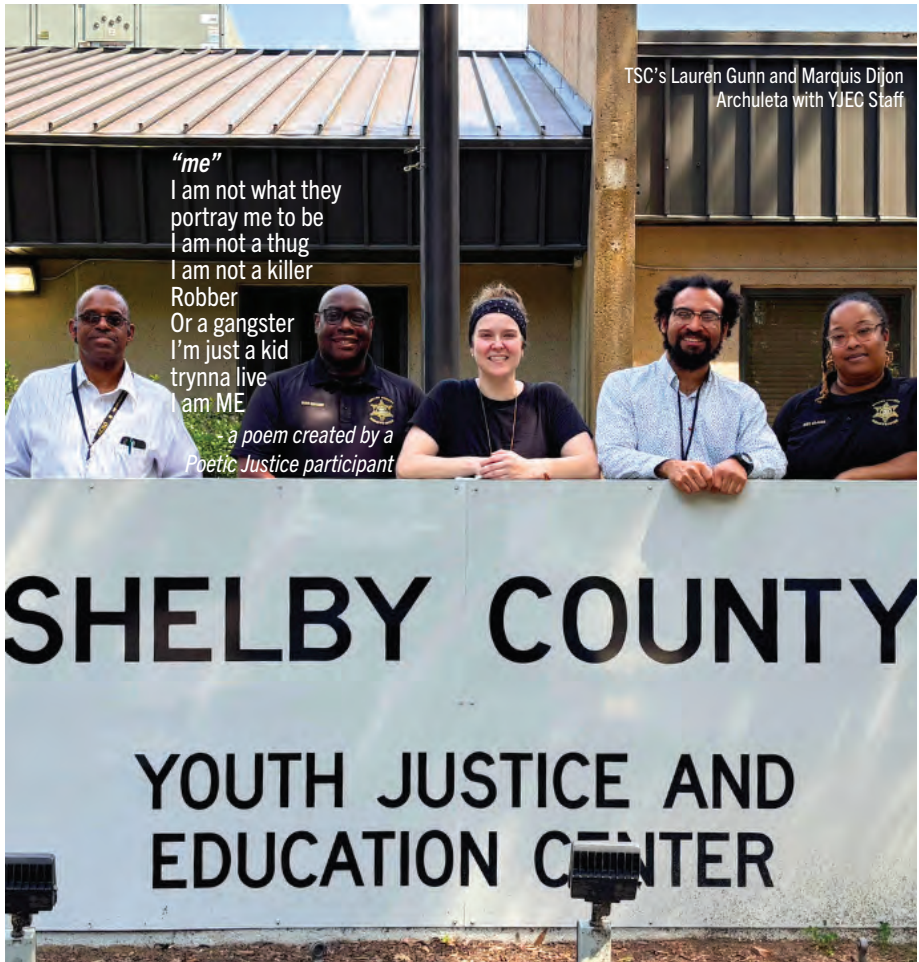

## THE JUVENILE JUSTICE PROGRAM

*Juvenile Justice*, now in its 11<sup>th</sup> year, provides residencies for justice-involved youth and young adults in Shelby County detention facilities. We have served nearly 700 young people, many of whom have faced the possibilities of imprisonment, long-term detention, or foster care. In the past, *Juvenile Justice* provided performance-centered programming around Shakespeare and thought-provoking contemporary works. Four years ago, the Tennessee Arts Commission funded a new project, *Poetic Justice*, which was a summer camp for incarcerated youth focused on creative writing and introducing poetical forms. Based on its success and recent grantor support, we have combined *Juvenile Justice* and *Poetic Justice* in Season 18 to provide four poetry residencies for these young people. Their poems are collected in a chapbook that is published on our website and in a hard copy that lives on in the youth facility libraries. In Summer 2024, the students crafted over 50 poems. We are eager to return to our students for the additional residencies this season and are currently seeking grant and donor support to continue this vital programming.



## THE FEAST OF CRISPIAN-SOUTH PROGRAM

*The Feast of Crispian-South* is the only Shakespeare program working with V.A. Medical Center in-patients in the country. *FoCS* has engaged over 1,100 military Veterans in the past decade with Shakespeare and creative writing. By investigating his plays and language, Veterans take this opportunity to process the challenges of post-deployment life or substance abuse. With a combination of performance and creative writing prompts, we facilitate collaboration, self-reflection, and community in a brave and supportive environment through TSC's lead Teaching-Artist Lauren Gunn. Medical personnel at the VA work together with TSC to provide the best care for the patients. The program is conducted at the Memphis V.A. Medical Center and is recommended to participants by their practitioners. This program is funded in part by FedEx, AutoZone through an ArtsZone grant, and the Tennessee Arts Commission through an Arts Access Grant.
